

In the News:

More people rescued from slavery, an answer to our prayers?

Our newsletter on the 25th November, asked people to pray into the issue of modern day slavery and for people to be released from this. The day after this newsletter went out, 17 more people were rescued. I believe that our prayers, at least in part, contributed to these people being released - Thank you and let's keep praying!

This is an excerpt from an article entitled : "<u>Britain vows to</u> <u>crack down on slavery after women's rescue</u>," 3rd December BY Belinda Goldsmith, UK.reuters.com

Britain vowed on Tuesday to step up its fight against modern-day slavery, warning that the discovery last month of three women imprisoned for 30 years in horrific conditions in London was just the tip of the iceberg.

Home Secretary Theresa May said police last week rescued a further 17 people in Leeds, northern England, mainly Slovakians, who were living in poor housing with no access to local support services while forced to work long hours for little or no pay.

Speaking at an international women's rights conference, she said there had never been a more urgent need to tackle modern slavery which can include human trafficking, forced labour and marriage, sexual exploitation and domestic servitude.

Testimony

Lucy Littlewood from Rugby wrote to me a few weeks ago to tell us about a prayer event planned in Rugby: On our map you can click on <u>Pray for Rugby</u> to see which streets they are covering. Here follows an explanation of the prayer event and a report on how it went. with plans for the future.

Plans for the prayer night 15 November:-

"This will be an inclusive evening of prayer to launch prayer for Rugby and the year of Evangelism under the HOPE banner. There will be a time of confession, worship, a short word of encouragement and sharing of prayer initiatives from 7.30-9pm, followed by opportunities to experience different types of prayer under the themes of Nurture: 'Love one Another'; Deepening: 'Remain in Me' and Sowing: 'You will be my witnesses' which are themes from HOPE 2014. Christmas and New Year Preparations



From 9.15 to 11pm we are hoping there will be different prayer stations with three, 25 minute slots where people can move from one prayer room to another. Each slot can use one of the themes as a focus to pray for different issues within the town of Rugby. There will also be other resources available where people require this. We hope that the richness of our different traditions will enable people to connect with God in a variety of ways and prepare the way spiritually for evangelism and outreach by churches in their communities.

We also hope to run a 24-7 prayer room for the weekend and make available lots of resources for people to use through the year. That is where wanting the map of Rugby comes in!"

Reporting on the prayer night on 15th November

It went really well. We had 120 people arrive for the prayer meeting and probably around 15 different churches represented. It was a great evening with everyone celebrating together and then praying in the different sessions. People went away with all sorts of information for praying for Hope14. All the church leaders were prayed for together and we had a joint confession over lack of unity in the past. I am planning a second phase of giving out maps and signing up forms to the church leaders at a joint breakfast later this month so that we can get more people signed up. There are 1055 streets in Rugby so it would only take 21 churches praying for 25 streets each to cover half the town. It ought to be easy to get at least half the streets prayed for. I will collate bundles of names and send to you over the next 6 weeks (I hope). We had so much going on, the map did not get as much attention as I wanted, but the second phase should correct that!
