


### Dear Carl,




### Testimony


A Burlington Baptist Missional Community, Burlington, Ipswich



This story is based upon an interview with Simon Harris, the Senior leader of Burlington Baptist church, Ipswich, with additions from Julie Kite, the Missional Community leader and Conor Moore, the leader of the project. {small font}



About two years ago, a member of our church community, Conor Moore, at Burlington Baptist church, approached Julie Kite, our missional communities team leader. He asked if he could serve tea and coffee to the one hundred and twenty people, he had seen pass the church on foot, while the service was going on. He wanted to let people know we were here and to listen to the needs in the wider community. He felt God was asking him to take a tea trolley to the end of the car park in order to do this. Part of our wider vision as a church, is to encourage people to develop a missional vision for the local community or their networks of relationships and develop missional communities to support that vision; so obviously we told him to go for it!



The road our church is on is London road, well known for all the wrong reasons. Several years ago, London road was the subject of national media attention because of the murder of five women. It might have been easy to assume we knew what the needs of our neighbours were - but God asked us to listen carefully to those that passed by.

As the project began, Conor was the only one person handing out teas and coffees and chatting to our neighbours. It wasn't long though before 6 others joined him, providing teas and coffees and biscuits. Several months later, a community of people were regularly gathering on the street each Sunday morning and meeting together, many on the margins of society. Some of the people were homeless, some with various addictions, some



just lonely, some looking for community. All this was happening at the same time as our regular Sunday service inside! There have been multiple opportunities to talk about Jesus and offer prayer. People started coming back a week later, saying that their prayers had been answered... they had found a home , or a job or been healed.

Conor writes:

*An example of this is one of our regular guests had no electric in her house and the people who were supposed to put new carpet down were refusing. We prayed about it with her on the Church park. The next week she came running up to us, threw her arms around me and said "that prayer works!" carpet down, electric on. One of our homeless guests who was really struggling on the streets was trying to get a flat to live in, but kept getting refused and turned away. We prayed with him on the church car park about it one Sunday. During the week while at work I was walking through the town centre when this man grabbed me and gave me a massive hug and said "that prayer works, I have somewhere to live!"*

*Over time several people have come to faith, by the end of this year, five will have been baptised. Now every Sunday, we are offering food such as beans on toast and offering practical help such as giving clothes away and sharing community! The members of our church who take part, take it in turns to attend Sunday services or to join in part of the services. The leadership team meets with the leaders of this and our six other missional communities each week, to invest in them and help them in their walk with Jesus. During the week and every Sunday the church members of this missional community meet together for prayer, discipleship and fellowship.*

*The first Sunday of every month, we have communion and we now share communion outside our church building as well! News about this missional community is spreading with positive results. There are now five families working together each Sunday with 15-20 people involved altogether. They are part of one big family, a family on mission together. Our neighbours who come along for tea and coffee each week, belong to our church family, perhaps, before they believe!*
