


Dear Carl,

Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby's Speech @ launch of HOPE 2014

On 24th November at Lambeth Palace, Hope 2014 was launched. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby gave a fantastic speech, encouraging us to imagine what the nation might look like in 2063. He suggested that if the church unites and works together and we all take personal responsibility to share our faith with friends, neighbours and family; our nation would be transformed. He highlighted in his speech, the catalyst that he believed HOPE 2014 would be for united mission, prayer and transformation.






Excerpts from the speech

*"We look back and are thankful that in the first couple of decades of the 21st century the churches put aside their differences and chose - chose, it didn't just happen, they chose consciously - to pray and work together. ...
 ...And this happened because the churches gave themselves to unity but to diversity in unity, to difference in unity..."*





...But I want to highlight three things that I see as key, looking back [from 2063]. The first of them was the Church believed again that it is the role of every member of the Church of Jesus Christ to bear witness to their faith. If it had not been for the responsibility that ordinary members of the Church took with their friends and neighbours in their localities and communities, we would not be where we are now. Something happened all those years ago to give every Christian person confidence in the notion that they individually were to be witnesses to Jesus Christ. Simply to give testimony to who they'd experienced Jesus to be with them. There was a lot of training - events like Hope trained every community, every person, every church. The Bible Society was enormously important. Courses like Alpha and Emmaus, all sorts of things, contributed widely to people's ability to say to others: 'I know Jesus Christ and I want to introduce you to him.'

And when people did this they saw the most attractive demonstrations of the transforming love of Jesus Christ turning individuals' lives upside down, or rather the right way up, and making them completely different people. So, every Christian became a witness. Secondly, the Church demonstrated that it had confidence that the best thing that anyone can ever do with their lives is to follow Jesus Christ. Not merely that it's good for them, or good for their marriage, or for their money; but it is the best thing. It is the only way to have a complete life. And this confidence was shown not just in proclamation - in fact it wasn't even primarily in proclamation looking back at it, but through the way we lived our lives. Christians learned afresh to be known as those who forgave each other when things went wrong..."

Testimony: Neighbours start coming to church after years of prayer and sharing faith.

In June this year, both my husband and my father died within ten days of each other. My husband had a chronic health problem, but the death was unexpected and sudden and a shock to our neighbours, who used to see him out and about in his wheelchair. Since this happened, I have had the opportunity to speak to so many of my neighbours. One mother, who I'd invited to church many times, suddenly started bringing her children to church with her. I have been able to talk to her about my faith. The family across the road sent me a sympathy card and quite a few others have spoken to me, helped me and said they were praying for me. A few others have come to church events.

Over the years my husband and I had prayed for our neighbours and on occasion put invitations to church events through our neighbours' doors, at Easter, at Christmas and at special events, so our neighbours knew we were Christians. We also took part in the "Battle for



Britain" campaign that God TV ran a few years ago. My husband and I befriended a man who lived on his own and helped him when he needed help. We used to give him a meal every week and we were able to share the Gospel with this neighbour, before he died recently. It has been easier to invite my neighbours to church and church events because the church has put on a lot of community events. Recently we had a hog roast and the local councillor hearing about it, donated £300 to the event. The church has put on lot of other events such as firework displays.

Losing my husband and father so close together has been devastating, but since it happened, so many of my neighbours have spoken to me and been kind to me. I continue to pray for my street, that all will "be saved."
