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#### **An epidemic of Loneliness**

Last Friday 18th, Jeremy Hunt sparked a national debate about loneliness in our society, saying;

"According to the Campaign to End Loneliness, there are 800,000 people in England who are chronically lonely. Some five million people say television is their main form of company - that's 10% of the population. We know there is a broader problem of loneliness that in our busy lives we have utterly failed to confront as a society. Each and every lonely person has someone who could visit them and offer companionship. A forgotten million who live amongst us ignored to our national shame."

This quote appeared in multiple national newspapers and media outlets. Regardless of our own personal political affiliations and thoughts about government policy; the reality of loneliness is a daily misery for many people, of all ages. As a GP, I was confronted with many people on home visits, who were unable to leave their home most of the month, because of severe illness. This was most often elderly people, but younger people were also affected. Sadly because family had moved away, I was the only person they might see for days or in some cases, weeks on end.


#### **Caring for our Neighbours**

On our streets, we no doubt all live near someone who is suffering from loneliness or perhaps some of you also feel lonely a lot of the time. We could all make a huge difference across the nation, if we all tried to make time on a Friday, or over the weekend, for one of our neighbours who lives alone. Do not underestimate the impact of a kind word, a card at









christmas, birthdays, during illness. I am personally challenged at the moment, about whether I could sacrifice some time in front of the TV, to make time for a neighbour.

Can I challenge you, this month, with a friend, a relative or someone from church, to try to get to know an adult neighbour, who lives alone?
